

FORMATION AND ANIMATION ACCOMPANIMENT OF THE *MORNESE* FMA PAST PUPILS ASSOCIATION IN THE SIX YEARS 2016-2021

1. Formation and accompaniment as a first commitment

As a World Delegate, my first commitment in the Association is to take care of the formative processes indicated in the Sector Planning for the Salesian Family and the specific paths for the FMA Past Pupils Association. To carry out this task I kept in mind:

- the knowledge of the 2015 Statute and the deep study of the spirituality of the Past Pupil,
 through the Formation Units sent to the Delegates and Federation Presidents every two months and published in the Union Magazine for all the associates;
- the updating of the Delegates and Presidents of the Federation through some topical documents at the charismatic, ecclesial, and civil levels;
- ongoing sharing with the Delegates and Presidents of the Federations, using the available means of communication;
- the animation of Federations and Unions through on-site visits as a privileged moment of formation, knowledge, and enhancement of the different realities, and as a space for growth in the sense of belonging. In the six-year period, 45 Federations and 115 Unions were visited.
 - In the time of the pandemic, virtual meetings have multiplied at all levels. To date, I have participated in 246 meetings on different online platforms.
- attention to rediscovering the value of the Salesian Family as an expression of the Salesian charism and a way to the future. In this regard, I participated in and encouraged the participation of Past Pupils in the Salesian Family Spirituality Days every year in January. As a Delegate, I am a member of the Preparation Team for these Days and annually represent the Association in the World Council of the Salesian Family.

1. Continental Congresses of the Association

The Continental Congresses were: a privileged space for dialogue with the World Confederation; an opportunity for formation, encounter, and growth in the sense of belonging, as well as intergenerational, intercultural, interreligious dialogue; moments of common commitment. About 935 people took part in these events, including Past Pupils and Delegates. In addition to participation, I was involved in the preparation of each event with the Federation Councils and the Past Pupils of every continent.

Active and proactive participation in networking initiatives with the local Church and with the territory multiplies the possibilities and strengthens the inclusion of all, especially the most vulnerable and excluded.

6. Challenges for the future

After this long journey, and on the basis of the knowledge acquired about the Association, I consider these to be challenges for the future:

- stimulate the sense of belonging to the Association, through communication and synergy between the members, in the Unions, Federations, and worldwide;
- know and study the Identity Document, the new Statute, and the Identity Card of the Salesian Family;
- develop a formation plan for the associates as well as for the directors and for the lay contact person;
- give the Association a clearer imprint of solidarity and social commitment, in fidelity to its original characteristic;
- present the Association as an opportunity even for those who belong to other religions or are non-believers - to live the Mornese Salesian charism as a space for growth, accompaniment, friendship, service to families and the most needy;
- give visibility to the Association in educational communities, social networks, etc.
- Create links between youth ministry, youth groups and the Association.
